According to the Book of Order, "Ordered ministries are gifts to the church to order its life so that the ministry of the whole people of God may flourish." (G.20102) These ordered ministries consist of the office of Deacon and Elder. For an overseer, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled, upright, holy, and disciplined. He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it.
