The Words of Preparation

Q. 168. What is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's supper is a sacrament of the New Testament, wherein by giving and receiving bread and wine according to the appointment of Jesus Christ, His death is showed forth; and they that worthily communicate, feed upon His body and blood to their spiritual nourishment and growth in grace; have their union and communion with Him confirmed; testify and renew their thankfulness and engagement to God, and their mutual love and fellowship each with other, as members of the same mystical body.

Q. 170. How do they that worthily communicate in the Lord's Supper feed upon the body and blood of Christ therein?

As the body and blood of Christ are not corporally or carnally present in, with, or under the bread and wine in the Lord's supper; and yet are spiritually present to the faith of the receiver...so they that worthily communicate in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper do therein feed upon the body and blood of Christ...in a spiritual manner; yet truly and really, while by faith they receive and apply to themselves Christ crucified, and all the benefits of His death.

For an overseer, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled, upright, holy, and disciplined. He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it. Titus 1:7-9
