The Journey to Bethlehem (from Luke 2)

So Joseph married Mary and then it happened. A decree went out from Augustus Caesar that touched every part of Israel. Everybody had to go back to their ancestral home in order to be registered for a census. So Joseph and Mary had to travel all the way to a little town called Bethlehem, about 75 miles –just when Mary was about to have her baby. Such a long trip. How hard and difficult it must have been. When they arrived they found a quiet place in crowded Bethlehem out in one of the caves, where the animals would be put up for the night. The carol tells us the story and includes in stanza three our prayer on this holy night.
