The mission works with local villagers in Malawi, Tanzania and Zambia by digging wells for their villages and teaching them how to maintain them. The cost per well (serving 120 people) is \$450. We have supported this effort since 2009. Our goal this year is \$13,500 for 30 wells, which brings our total to 275 wells.
