Dr. Charles W. Kerr Display: Dr. Charles W. Kerr was a dynamic and passionate leader who served as pastor of First Church from 1900 to 1941. During his tenure, which featured explosive church growth, Dr. Kerr dedicated three church buildings, including the current Sanctuary. An exhibit of Dr. Kerr's personal ministry tools, curated by History and Archives, is on view now in the Miller Library.

Maundy Thursday Seder Dinner: On Thursday, March 28 we will gather in Stephenson Hall for a Seder dinner. This meal will be a child-friendly celebration of God delivering His people out of bondage, and an experience offering us clearer understanding of the Last Supper in the context of the Passover
