Wednesday Night Downtown

April 3 – May 1, 6:15 – 7:30 p.m.:

Seekers Bible Study: Rev. Wambugu Gachungi leads an in-depth study of the Sunday morning sermon scriptures. Come enjoy praying together, studying the Bible, and engaging in lively questions and discussions.

Rupture and Repair: God's story in every human relationship: Join Rev. James R. Estes and Dr. Tom Philp for a four-week exploration of the ways we hurt and heal in the context of relationships. Each week will consider a Biblical narrative through the lens of rupture and repair while exploring the invitation to vulnerability, grace and truth in the context of everyday relationships. Includes robustly validated relational insights, and weekly "relationship hacks" to help move any relationship from surviving to thriving.

The Enneagram, A Tool for Transformation led by certified Enneagram teacher, Liz Decker. How would your life change if you could better understand how God created you uniquely? Drawing from scripture, interviews, and visuals to help explain the 9 basic personality types, we will discover the core motivations that explain what makes us who we are and learn acceptance and compassion for ourselves and others. **Registration is closed.**
