The Words of Preparation

The reason why Paul wrote this letter, and the reason we have it, is because the Galatians had "changed positions" on a crucial subject...this change was opting for a system in which grace was not crucial and in which Christ's work was not sufficient. Paul states here that they were "deserting the one who called you" that is to say, their move was not just an intellectual one. Rather, it was desertion of God as made known in Christ; it was abandoning of their personal relationship with God.
