The Story of Pentecost Part 2: The Response to the Spirit

(NLT Acts 2:5-24, 32-41)

Narrator:

At that time there were devout Jews from every nation living in Jerusalem. When they heard the loud noise, everyone came running, and they were bewildered to hear their own languages being spoken by the believers. They were completely amazed.

Crowds:

How can this be? These people are all from Galilee, and yet we hear them speaking in our own native languages! Here we are—And we all hear these people speaking in our own languages about the wonderful things God has done!

Narrator:

They stood there amazed and perplexed.

Crowds:

What can this mean?

Narrator:

But others in the crowd ridiculed them, saying,

Crowds:

They're just drunk, that's all!

Narrator:

Then Peter stepped forward with the eleven other apostles and shouted to the crowd,

Simon Peter:

Listen carefully, all of you, fellow Jews and residents of Jerusalem! Make no mistake about this. These people are not drunk, as some of you are assuming. Nine o'clock in the morning is much too early for that. No, what you see was predicted long ago by the prophet Joel:

The Prophet:

'In the last days,' God says, 'I will pour out my Spirit upon all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your young men will see visions, and your old men will dream dreams. In those days I will pour out my Spirit even on my servants—men and women alike—and they will prophesy. And I will cause wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below—blood and fire and clouds of smoke. The sun will become dark, and the moon will turn blood red before that great and glorious day of the Lord arrives. But everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

Simon Peter:

People of Israel, listen! God publicly endorsed Jesus the Nazarene by doing powerful miracles, wonders, and signs through him, as you well know. But God knew what would happen, and his prearranged plan was carried out when Jesus was betrayed. With the help of lawless Gentiles, you nailed him to a cross and killed him. But God released him from the horrors of death and raised him back to life, for death could not keep him in its grip.

God raised Jesus from the dead, and we are all witnesses of this. Now he is exalted to the place of highest honor in heaven, at God's right hand. And the Father, as he had promised, gave him the Holy Spirit to pour out upon us, just as you see and hear today. For David himself never ascended into heaven, yet he said,

King David:

'The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit in the place of honor at my right hand until I humble your enemies, making them a footstool under your feet."'

Simon Peter:

So let everyone in Israel know for certain that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, to be both Lord and Messiah!

Narrator:

Peter's words pierced their hearts, and they said to him and to the other apostles,

The Crowds:

Brothers, what should we do?

Simon Peter:

Each of you must repent of your sins and turn to God, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. This promise is to you, to your children, and to those far away—all who have been called by the Lord our God."

Narrator:

Then Peter continued preaching for a long time, strongly urging all his listeners,

Simon Peter:

Save yourselves from this crooked generation!

Narrator:

Those who believed what Peter said were baptized and added to the church that day—about 3,000 in all.

Friends, the same promise of new life in Christ is for us and for our children! May we respond with joy in repentance, receiving the fulness of the Spirit that comes through faith in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior! In these moments, let us prepare our hearts to confess our sins and to receive God's grace and forgiveness.
